

2022 IAOS Young Statisticians Prize

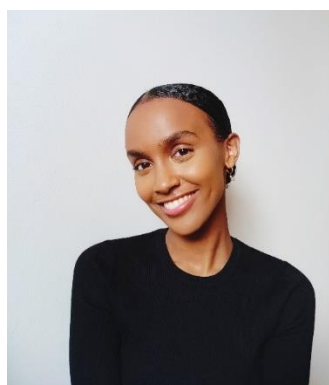
Do you work for an agency that produces official statistics?

Enter the 2022 IAOS Young Statisticians Prize



Ms. Elham Sirag (pictured) and Mr. Gautier Gissler both work at Statistics Canada and won the first place prize in 2021 for their paper *Estimating excess mortality in Canada during the COVID-19 pandemic: Statistical methods adapted for rapid response in an evolving crisis*

Elham and Gautier shared a cash prize of €1,500 and received a two-year IAOS membership and certificate acknowledging her success in the competition. In addition, the IAOS will fund registration fees, airfare, and hotel accommodation for Elham and/or Gautier to present their paper at an international conference once COVID-19 restrictions pass.
